COURSE DESCRIPTION

An introduction to curriculum and instruction in elementary social studies. Focus is on thoughtful and purposeful instruction in social studies, requiring that students be able to select appropriate instructional strategies, curriculum materials, and evaluation methods to meet a variety of school and classroom settings. Students will be required to relate theory in social sciences, educational psychology, philosophy, and sociology to practice in the social studies classroom. A field study of Fort Langley is included.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Students will be required to prepare written and oral presentations and to prepare examples of instructional materials. There will be no final examination.

There are no required texts for this course. Students will be required to do a number of readings from materials placed on reserve in the library.
