- 4. Can evaluate the effectiveness of different strategies of teaching content and can design content for more than one strategy.
- 5. Can develop an objectives approach to the teaching of knowledge and skills.
- 6. Can design short and longer range curriculum units that meet specific and general objectives.

These objectives will be pursued through the following activities:

- 1. Class and group disucussions leading to written analyses.
- 2. Analyses of selected references.
- 3. Writing objectives for lesson plans.
- 4. Developing curriculum materials appropriate to teaching interests of the participant.
