- Communication in Social Studies Questioning and Discussion
- Practising Social Studies aims modelling

Course Requirements:

Attendance, readings and participation in session activities. A 5-page curriculum critique. Participation in a group project and a field study. Development of an outline of a unit, incorporating ideas learned in the sessions.
