OVERVIEW

This course is designed for prospective and practising secondary teachers and examines the theory and practice of social studies education. Sessions will be interactive; students will participate in a number of instructional strategies introduced during the course. At least one session will be located off campus and involve a field study.

- 4. The "content" versus "process" debate
- 5. Developing concepts, skills and attitudes
- 6. Teaching strategies (e.g. simulations, grouping, storytelling, field studies)
- 7. A global education perspective
- 8. Unit planning methodology, resources, evaluation

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Participation in a group project/presentation. Participation in a simulation. Development of a short unit plan on one aspect of social studies. Completion of a short (4 page) paper which addresses a current issue in social studies. Attendance and participation in the sessions.
