# PREREQUISITE: Educ 401/402

### **OVERVIEW:**

This course examines the theory and practice of socials studies education at the secondary level. The objective of this course is to enhance student abilities in planning and delivering effective instruction in the classroom. Several topics will be discussed and students will be expected to apply the ideas found in the course literature to the classroom setting. Two sessions will be held off campus.

## **TOPICS DISCUSSED INCLUDE:**

- the history, philosophy and goals of social studies education
- a critical examination of the B.C. Social Studies curriculum
- the integration of geography, law, history, and economics in teaching Social Studies
- teaching for social responsibility and citizenship
- critical thinking and teaching skills in Social Studies
- instructional strategies in the classroom
- lesson and unit planning approaches, finding and using resources, and evaluation
