EDUCATION 474-4 DESIGNS FOR LEARNING: SOCIAL STUDIES

This course is divided into three parts. In part one, the foundations of developing a coherent Social Studies program in an elementary or secondary classroom are explored. The second part examines how to promote each of the five major goals in Social Studies. These goals are: 1) learning factual and conceptual knowledge, 2) thinking critically, 3) gathering and reporting information, 4) developing personal and social values, and 5) learning to take effective individual and collective action. The focus is on learning the practical strategies to teach for these goals in the context of acquiring a better understanding of what these goals really mean. Part three looks at the implementation of teaching ideas into the classroom. Topics covered include integrating the curriculum, evaluating student learning, and unit and lesson planning.
