COURSE DESCRIPTION

This methods course is for secondary social studies teachers. The course has three main themes:

- 1. Foundations —learning about the underlying rationales and major building blocks of social studies;
- 2. Ends and means —introduction to the teaching strategies and learning resources available to promote the goals of social studies;
- 3. Implementation —learning to plan for effective instruction and authentic assessment.

OBJECTIVE

To enhance teachers' ability to plan and deliver an effective social studies program at the secondary school level that is engaging for students and goes beyond the passive transmission of historical and geographic facts. A major emphasis is on infusing critical thinking in all aspects of social studies.

Much of the learning will revolve around a cooperative project where students will develop and refine a comprehensive set of materials to support the teaching of social studies at a grade level of their choosing. Disk copies of all resources produced will be shared with other members of the class.
