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**PREREQUISITES: EDUC 401/2**

This course is for elementary school teachers. Its intent is to provide a thorough introduction to Social Studies as a curricular area, within a professional, student-centred, and collaborative academic setting.

**OBJECTIVES:**

- to familiarize students with the content, organization and problematic nature of the Social Studies curriculum in British Columbia.
- to develop a critical appreciation of the place of Social Studies in the educational experience and lives of children and young adults.
- to create, in a collaborative environment, engaging lessons and units including a variety of student-centred activities, authentic assessment strategies, extension ideas, and resources.
- to examine the Social Studies curriculum through a variety of lenses and approaches such as: critical thinking, cooperative learning, diversity, integrated study, social justice, environment, citizenship and global perspectives.
