Aims of art education; key concepts; BC curriculum; making and appreciating art; art history; children and art; gallery visit; hands on experience with art media; computer art; multicultural art; planning and teaching; evaluation; individual programs; the role of imagination in teaching; some controversies; integrating the arts.
