DESCRIPTION

This course introduces students to the ideas, practicalities, and concerns that form the basis of the teaching of visual art.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To familiarize students with the requirements of the BC curriculum, the Year 2000 materials, and other concerns currently affecting art education.
- 2. To acquaint students with the basic concepts of art education and to develop programs in art for particular groups of students as required.
- 3. To guide students in the use of basic art media.
