COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course introduces students to the basic ideas and practicalities involved in teaching art to children in schools.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To develop an understanding of the purposes and methods of art education.
- 2. To enable teachers to develop programs in art for particular groups of students.

COURSE CONTENT

The aims of art education; BC curriculum, making and appreciating art; art history; using the art gallery; hands-on experience with art media (painting, drawing, clay, crafts, sculpture/construction, printmaking, photography/video, etc.); art and environment; multicultural and feminist issues; integrating the arts; planning and teaching; evaluation.
