OBJECTIVES

Understanding and creating musical structures.

STRATEGIES

- 1. Music literacy vocabulary and concepts concerning the elements of music (duration/rhythm, pitch/melody, timbre, texture, dynamics, form), will be developed through listening, singing, discussing and creating with various acoustic and electronic sound sources.
- 2. Teaching strategies research on a topic will be conducted (music method, composer, style, technology); integration of musical concepts and skills with other curriculum areas (plastic arts, creative dance, Social Studies, Science and Language Arts) will be developed; a sequential music unit will be planned; learning in this course will be experiential to aid development of a comfortable teaching style and understanding of students' needs.
