OBJECTIVES:

The participant will acquire a better understanding of the theories, approaches and methodology in the teaching of French as a second language; study aspects and application of current curriculum (linguistic and cultural) and coourse materials used in French as a second language programs in British Columbia; study and practise teaching techniques; acquire skills in evaluating second language teaching and learning. The focus will be on practical application of the above.
