- •Programming applications in the curriculum
- •Electronic communications in education

COURSE ACTIVITIES

Course activities will consist of lectures and discussions, demonstrations, readings, team projects and laboratory work.

EVALUATION

A term paper on selected computer applications in the classroom.

A class presentation evaluating a piece of software, demonstrating its uses in the classroom or an educational setting.

Short tests related to readings, discussions and demonstrations.

Laboratory exercises demonstrating computer operating skills.
