COURSE OUTLINE

The course will consist of two concurrent programs, I and II, viz.:

- A program of directed reading. This part of the course will not be supervised. The student will be expected to show evidence of his reading in the second program of the course;
- A program of seminars and individual tutorials. In this part of the course, the student will be evaluated on the basis of his performance in a number of independent projects of his own choice as approved by the instructor.

- I The directed reading program subsumes 3 related areas viz.:
 A. Linguistic; B. Psychological; and C. Educational; theory,
 as applied to the teaching of a second language.
- II Seminars and individual tutorials in the areas of:

- * planning, preparation and teaching of sample units, lessons, sequential programs;
- * selection, construction, and evaluation of instructional materials:
- * demonstrations and laboratory experiences in the use of audio tapes and loops; slides, filmstrips and films; e.t.v.; overhead transparencies, opaque visuals, graphics, models and displays, etc.
- * the application of past reading and experiences to problem-solving in classroom teaching.
