# EDUCATION 489 SPRING 1979

<u>Title</u>: Educating Awareness: Implications for Educational Practice
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An alternative perspective arising from physical and social science research is emerging which postulates that education is (1) a process through which energy is structured, (2) a fundamental means of human evolution, and (3) equivalent to the education of awareness of one's self. This course will critically examine this postulation and the implications it has for educational practice.

The course will take the form of a seminar to critically analyse the work of several authors who have focused on the education of awareness. Students will study selected readings of recent empirical research and theoretical speculations of how man has evolved, how he learns, and how he educates himself. Students will, in addition, experience and have opportunities to apply and subsequently evaluate new approaches to educational practice.

### Course Outline

- I. Education as the Structuring of Energy 4 sessions.
- 2. Education as a Means of Human Evolution 4 sessions.
- 3. Education as the Growth of Awareness 4 sessions.
- 4. Education Awareness as an Empirical Study 2 sessions.

#### Course Requirements:

It is not intended that students will read every book listed on the reading list. Students will, however, be required to read selected passages from each work as well as study intensely two or three of the books listed. A critical and scholarly analysis of one of these books must be submitted on or before the twelfth session of the course.

In addition, each student will be required to empirically study themselves or others in the process of learning. A report of this study must be submitted on or before the twelfth session of the course.

Attendance and participation in all class activities is a normal expectation.
