THIS COURSE INTENDS TO:

- through readings, presentations and discussions, engage students in reflection on philosophical, theoretical and practical nature of culture as a global and personal concept;
- 2. encourage students to identify questions concerning First Nations language and culture within their communities;
- 3. introduce students to models of teacher-initiated research;
- 4. offer students the opportunity to study models, ideas and feedback from which they can begin to collate, analyze and present data collected during the summer portion of the course:
- 5. engage students in discussion and reflection on how their findings will impact upon them as teachers;
- 6. encourage students to consider the implications of teacher research in the language classroom, especially in terms of curriculum development for First Nations languages.

COURSE RQUIREMENTS:

It is expected that students will:

- 1. do all required readings;
- 2. attend all classes and participate actively in discussions and activities;
- 3. do all written and oral assignments within the time frame requested.

ASSIGNMENTS

Course Assignments will include all or some of the following:

- 1. a journal summary of events and reflections during the summer research project (September 30, 10%);
- 2. a written personal statement concerning the question of culture as it relates to First Nations peoples (September 30, 10%);
- 3. a written assignment reviewing and analyzing the methods of data collection used during the summer research project (October 14, 20%)
- 4. a 15-20 minute presentation and critical analysis of the data collected during the summer research project (October 28, November 18, 30%)
- 5. a written report on the summer research project (November 25, 30%)

Details of each assignment will be thoroughly discussed in class.
