- 3. To develop knowledge of theatre skills and theatrical conventions.
- 4. To have students engage in critical discussion regarding the educational value of theatre.

# **OUTLINE OF TOPICS:**

## A selection from the following:

the drama/theatre debate; the educational value of theatre; selecting a script; director's preparation; interpreting a script; casting; blocking; the rehearsal process; scene design, stage lighting, stage makeup; costumes; stage management; alternatives to traditional scripts; pedagogical issues in teaching theatre.
