In turn, the current prerequisites suggest that a student needs both (BUS 207 and one of ECON 201 or ECON 301) in order to take BUS 421, when in fact they only need BUS 207 or one of its equivalents (ECON 201 or ECON 301). Thus, we request to reinstate the original, accurate formatting of these prerequisites.
