

RATIONALE

As an outcome of the SIAT Undergraduate Retreat, the Design Concentration Group recommended that we consider the design concentration as having a set of "destination" courses, and that these courses reflect a culmination of conceptual and technical design practice. There are 4 courses that were identified as "destination" courses: IAT 337, 338, 421, 432. In order to reflect the summative knowledge that exists in these courses, it was recommended that these course be numbered as fourth year courses. This means modifying IAT 337-3 to IAT 437-3 and IAT 338-3 to IAT 438-3. No other changes are being made to these courses other than the course number.
