The music area of the SCA would like to add FPA 245-3 Music Composition I to the lower level required courses in all music streams including composition, electroacoustic and honours. The credit hours do not change.

Rationale:

By requiring FPA 245 in all music streams (composition, electroacoustic, and honors), we are ensuring that all music students can read and write music effectively while possessing an essential pre-requisite to most courses in the music program. FPA 245 Music Composition I is the first of a series of upper division theory and selected topics courses.

Requiring FPA 245 gives our students many more options on their degree path while increasing their skills in musical literacy.

Undergraduate Curriculum School for the Contemporary Arts Film Area

The film area in the School for the Contemporary Arts is streamlining offerings for video training within the film major curriculum. This change follows the dropping of FPA 290 Video Production in 2011 in order to make room for core courses in the SCA. To make a clear progression from introductory video training to more advanced, the area is shifting the level of FPA 390 from advanced to introductory and using FPA 393 as the more advanced video training course. The area is deleting FPA 333 Cinematography and Lighting to accommodate this change as more students are moving away from 16 mm film production and into digital media.

This change requires description and title changes for FPA 390 and FPA 393.
