Cognitive Studies

FREN 492 – Honours Essay – **Retain**

All four courses should be maintained in a visible record to indicated to students the possibility of Co-op (FREN 385 and FREN 485, respectively third and fourth year work experience);

FREN 491 and FREN 492 represent the honours' program, respectively preparation for the honours' essay and the honours' essay itself. Co-op and honours are promoted at every occasion as available options within the program.

Gerontology

GERO 409 – Mental Health and Aging – **Temporarily Withdrawn**

GRK 104 – Modern Greek for Reading Comprehension I – **Delete**

GSWS is hiring a new faculty and will expect the person to teach this course.

GSWS 421, GSWS 422, GSWS 423 and GSWS 424 are Co-op courses – each course has two sections each semester (one for those on campus and one for those off campus). These are not teaching courses.
