

SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF JULY 6, 2015

1. Report of the Chair

The Chair, on behalf of Senate, expressed appreciation to the following senators whose terms of office expire on August 31, 2015: Owen Underhill and Kay Wiese.

The Chair reported on the June 2015 convocation ceremonies. The Chair noted that, along with the 4,000 graduating students and eight honorary degree recipients, the first cohort of the Aboriginal Executive MBA program received their degrees.

The Chair reported on a number of major national and international conferences he recently attended, including: the National Mathematics Conference on June 15th; the Teaching and Learning in Higher Education Conference, co-hosted with UBC on June 17th; the BC Council for International Education Conference on June 22nd; and the Canadian Water Summit on June 25th.

The Chair reported that the search for the new Vice-President, Academic and Provost is currently underway. An open forum was held on June 15th to receive input on the position and on the qualifications that the committee should look for in a candidate.

The Chair reported that the search committee for the new Vice-President, Finance and Administration has been constituted, following the very sad news of Pat Hibbitts passing. The open forum has been scheduled for July 9th at 2:00 p.m. and will be held simultaneously at all three campuses.

The Chair reported that SFU received nearly \$13 million in NSERC funding, including \$10 million in Discovery grants for 58 projects spanning 15 departments and schools and six faculties. The projects range from research on brain function and virtual reality to nano-scale physics and environmental modelling. SFU received \$1.2 million for research infrastructure through the Research Tools and Instruments program, which represents a 54% success rate for SFU in this program. Eight Discovery Accelerator Supplements (DAS) were awarded to recognize SFU researchers for the high quality and potential of their research programs.

The Chair reported on upcoming events. The SFU Employee Barbecue will be held on August 19, with staff and faculty from all three campuses invited to attend. SFU is a partner in the Indian Summer Festival, using SFU's facilities at the Goldcorp Centre for the Arts and other locales in Vancouver. This festival runs from July 9-18 and is a mixture of different cultural and intellectual experiences. SFU is a sponsor of the Surrey Fusion Festival on July 18-19, which

involves 100 staff, students, and faculty showcasing SFU's Surrey programs. SFU celebrates its 50th anniversary on September 9th. The major kickoff celebration will be held at 11:30 a.m. in Convocation Mall. In the evening, the celebration continues with a food fair, entertainment, and fireworks in the AQ courtyard.
