



The students are usually not sufficiently advanced to undertake analysis of literary style. The change of wording has been made in order to clarify that the courses are in fact conducted entirely in English for non-major and non-minor students. It also indicates that Russian major and minor students, although they attend lectures in English, take special Russian tutorials (for which they are prepared in Russian 301 and 302). In this way students who do not know Russian but who wish to study Russian literature are able to take the course, while Russian majors and minors are treated realistically in terms of their abilities, particularly if they are non-native speakers.
