

Rationale:

Since the calendar changes of 1973-74 it has become evident that students beginning French at 100-101-201 etc. are forced to drop FREN 201 because they do not have sufficient preparation. These students

should, therefore, be allowed to take FREN 100, 101, 151 before taking 201 etc.. On the other hand, since there is an ever increasing number of complete beginners, it was decided to reserve FREN 100 for complete beginners. An English speaking student coming from high school and taking French at Simon Fraser University could enter into either FREN 100 or 101 or 151 or 201 according to his competence.

No changes are needed for course challenge regulations. FREN 100-101 are being dropped from the Honors, Major and Minor Requirements as FREN 101 can no longer be taken instead of FREN 151.



The department realizes that this change will add another course to the program of many students. However, this is preferable to the present situation where some students lack the preparation for FREN 201.

For a degree in German, a student will be required to follow a program approved by the Division, including the following:

Lower Division Courses:

Honors and Major: GERM 100, 101, 201, 202, 240/241
or GERM 100, 101, 201, 202 and LING 130/221
Minor: GERM 100, 101, 201, 202

To be taken in the Upper Levels:

Honors: 50 units of German and Linguistics 300/400 series
Major: 30 units of German and Linguistics 300/400 series
Minor: GERM 300 or 301 or 302 and at least 12 hours of 400
division courses in German.

In addition, the Honors student will be expected to acquire a proficiency (i.e. the equivalent of two semesters) in a second language other than English and the language of his honors program.

to "For a degree in German, the following courses (or exemptions from them) are required.

Lower Division Courses:

Honors and Major: GERM 102 (formerly GERM 100), 103 (formerly GERM 101), 201, 202, 240 and 241 or GERM 102 (formerly GERM 100), 103 (formerly GERM 101), 201, 202, LING 130 and 221.
Minor: GERM 102 (formerly GERM 100), 103 (formerly GERM 101), 201, 202.

To be taken in Upper Levels:

Honors: 50 units of German, 300 and 400 series (9 of which may be taken from the 400 series in the Linguistics Division).

Major: 30 units of German 300 and 400 series (3 of which may be taken from the 300 and 400 series in the Linguistics Division).

Minor: GERM 300 or 301 or 302 and at least 12 hours of 400 division courses in German.

In addition, the Honors student will be expected to acquire a proficiency (i.e. the equivalent of two semesters) in a second language other than English and the language of his honors program."

Rationale: Students may now take a major or a minor in Linguistics. The German Division wishes to insure that the majority of the courses in the major are in German rather than in Linguistics.

Rationale:

Justification for request to raise credit value of German 100-level courses: At present there exists an obvious disparity between contact hours of the intensive German language program at the 100-level and the number of credits given (5 contact hours plus recommended practice time of 2 hours per week in the language lab for 3 credit units).

Two years ago, the German Division reduced the credits from 4 to 3. This was done not for language-pedagogical but for administrative reasons. It has since become clear to us that this change has created, rather than resolved, problems.

At that time, Spanish (like German) kept the same number of contact hours, but (unlike German) kept the same number of credits; whereas Russian (unlike German) reduced the number of contact hours, when (like German) they reduced the number of credits. For some reason, German got the worst of both alternatives and we wish to correct that situation.
