

Date November 14, 1974

At its meeting of 5th November, the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies discussed the attached proposal to permit students to include a maximum of twelve semester hours of credit in Special Topics Courses towards a Bachelor of Education degree. It should be noted that this applies only to Special Topics Courses in the Faculty of Education and not to those mounted by other Departments.

This proposal is now forwarded to Senate for its consideration, with the Committee's recommendation that it be approved.

Motion:

that the Faculty of Education establish Policy with respect to the maximum number of Special Topic credit hours that a student may include toward a Bachelor of Education Degree, specifically

A student may include a maximum of 12 semester hours of credit in Special Topic courses toward a Bachelor of Education Degree.

RATIONALE:

Special Topic courses permit the Faculty to be responsive, in the short term, to

- a) unique perspectives on an area or a problem offered by a faculty member or a visitor
eg. Mornings with Young Children - Sylvia Ashton-Warner
- b) opportunities to offer courses in liaison with other faculties or centres
eg. Outdoor Recreation - Martin Hendy
- c) the need for guided reading prior to taking a regularly offered course
eg. Readings in Inter-Cultural Education - June Wyatt
- d) a current thrust in educational practice
eg. Community Schools - Jack Stevens
- e) requests for advanced work in a subject area
eg. Advanced Art Education - M. Place (Ceramics) J. Jakobow (Weaving)

The Topics tend to be experimental, advanced, narrow in scope, indeed special topics as different from core educational topics in curriculum and teaching. Hence the recommendation to limit the Special Topic credits in the Bachelor of Education Degree.
