With increasing variability of relevant Kinesiology courses, the undergraduate curriculum committee considers greater freedom of choice be accorded Kinesiology majors in their upper level course work. At the same time, his ability to choose courses from outside the Department is preserved by the allocation of 9 semester (the balance of 45 upper division level courses) upper level hours to elective study.

Wherever it appears.
 In Kines. 044 and 344 the hours of work are better applied to the laboratory sessions than to formal lecturing. Some part of the laboratory sessions are devoted to theory in both courses but this is better presented in a situation where practical work may follow immediately and thus the vector description is better reflected as 0-0-4 in both cases. This does not mean that less work is envisaged in Kines. 344 by the dropping of the 1 hour lecture period.

Kines. 344 involves additionally a considerable amount of "a production" preparation outside the normal teaching situation.

The proposed calendar changes make available more Kinesiology courses to students majoring in Kinesiology at the upper level (>300). The required number of hours is set at 36 with 9 elected from any other department in the University. This move follows the direction the Department has taken in recent semesters, lessening the rigid structure of course requirements of heretofore at the upper level and allowing the student to chose courses more appropriate to his developing career goals. The final selection of his courses is still to be made in consultation with his faculty advisor.
