Following is a brief description of Calendar changes for the Africa/Middle East Studies Program.

These courses have been included under "Courses with Africa/Middle East Content" for the following reasons.

On p. 279 of the Calendar, the additional course, *Hist. 293-3 - Cultural and Intellectual History, is a presentation on History which has been omitted previously but would qualify if it contained sufficient Africa or Middle East content.

On p. 280 the courses noted below, approved by Senate in 1974 as part of the new Sociology and Anthropology curriculum, have been judged to contain sufficient Africa/Middle East course content to be used by students for credit towards the minor:
