

## SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 14, 2009

#### 1. Senate Membership

The Chair welcomed the following to their first meeting of Senate in their official capacity as Dean: Kris Magnusson, Dean, Faculty of Education; John Pierce, first Dean of the new Faculty of Environment; Tom Nesbit, Interim Dean of Continuing Studies; and Cheryl Geisler, first Dean of the new Faculty of Communication, Art & Technology.

#### 2. Enrolment – Fall 2009

Although a detailed report on enrolment was not available at this point, the Chair reported that both the domestic and international undergraduate enrolment was above expectations, and he wished to extend thanks to everyone from Student Services through to faculty and staff members in Faculties/Departments for the success of the recruitment/admission cycle.

#### 3. Student Orientation

The Chair also extended a special note of thanks to the Student Society and to the student volunteers for their tremendous contribution in making this Fall's Orientation for new students such a success.

#### 4. Budget

Commenting on recent press releases about the Provincial budget, the Chair reported that in comparison to many other public sectors, advanced education has been relatively well protected in that revisions to the earlier pre-election budget are minimal. The Chair pointed out however that advanced education is not entirely unaffected. Firstly, there has been a one-third cut to the ancillary capital budget which means that some urgent capital renovations and/or maintenance will not go forward this year, and secondly, there has been a global cut to student financial assistance, but again, the affect on university students at research institutions is not as great as at other post-secondary institutions. Because of the University's legal obligation to accommodate disabled students, cuts in this area will have to be picked up by the University. Cuts to the Michael Smith Foundation will affect funding for appointments and other research activities and collaborations at the research universities, and one of the biggest concerns is that transfers to post-secondary institutions will be frozen for the next three years which means that the costs of inflation will have to be absorbed through adjustments to expenses in the operating budget.

The Chair announced that consultations within the University will begin in the near future to address the difficulties of the budget cuts and how to respond to a freeze in funding over the next two to three years.

# 6. <u>Change to the Membership and Terms of Reference of the Senate</u> <u>Committee on International Activities (SCIA), and dissolution of the International Student Exchange Committee (ISEC) - Paper S.09-97</u>

Senate approved, effective immediately, changes to enlarge SCIA membership to include all Faculties; the transfer of the functions of ISEC to SCIA (including the approval for student exchange agreements); and the delegation of responsibility for the administration and approval of individual student exchanges from SCIA to SFU International. Following approval of these changes, Senate approved the dissolution of ISEC, effective immediately.

#### 7. <u>Dissolution of the B.C. Synchrotron Institute</u> – Paper <u>S.09-98</u>

Senate approved and recommended to the Board of Governors, that the B.C. Synchrotron Institute be dissolved as a Schedule A Centre in the Department of Physics in the Faculty of Science.

### 8. New Centre for Research on Sexual Violence – Paper S.09-99

Senate approved and recommended to the Board of Governors, that the Centre for Research on Sexual Violence be created as a Schedule A Centre based in the School of Criminology in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.

### 9. New Program: Certificate in Police Studies - Paper S.09-100

Senate approved and recommended to the Board of Governors, the proposal for a new undergraduate program – Certificate in Police Studies – in the School of Criminology in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.

### 10. New Program: Master of Arts in Humanities – Paper S.09-101

Senate approved and recommended to the Board of Governors, the proposal for a new graduate program – MA in Humanities – in the Department of Humanities in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.

# 11. <u>Undergraduate Curriculum Revisions - Faculty of Business</u> <u>Administration - Paper S.09-102</u>

Senate received information that the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies, acting under delegated authority, approved the following revisions:

- a) Revision to the eligibility calculation for admission of Category 2, 3, and 4 students to provide a relevant and consistent base of admission for internal and external students transferring to Business Administration at SFU
- b) Revision to requirements for the Honors program to allow the additional 12 units of 400 division courses required for an Honors program to qualify for concentrations
- c) Extension of the SFU Business Broad Based Admission Pilot program for Fall 2010.

# 12. <u>Undergraduate Curriculum Revisions - Faculty of Education</u> - Paper S.09-103

Senate received information that the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies, acting under delegated authority, approved the reinstatement of two temporarily withdrawn courses – EDUC 342 and EDUC 343.

# 13. <u>Undergraduate Curriculum Revisions – Faculty of Science</u> – Paper <u>S.09-104</u>

Senate received information that the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies, acting under delegated authority, approved the following curriculum revisions:

- Biological Sciences
  - Changes to the upper division requirements and electives in the Major program to reflect a change from four streams to the following three streams:

Cells, Molecules and Physiology Ecology, Evolution and Conservation Open
