SIAT Curriculum Changes

The following motion was approved by members of the SIAT Undergraduate Curriculum Committee on 8Jun2011.

Motion: Change the Pre-requisite text for IAT 403 for Fall 2012

Effective Date: Fall 2012.

This motion changes the pre-requisite text for IAT 403 to more clearly identify courses students are required to take for entry (see attached course change form). The number of units is increased to be consistent with this being a final year course, and the title is changed to be consistent with the colloquial title. Specifically, change the prerequisite to "Prerequisite: completion of 72 units, including IAT 201, 235, 265 and 12 upper division IAT units including IAT 309w. Students with credit for IAT 400 or 402 cannot take this course for further credit. Recommended: IAT 405 in the following semester".

Please include the above in the list of program changes at the next FCAT UCC meeting.

RATIONALE:

These changes are being done to address a number of issues:

- Title change to reflect that this is a final Capstone course for IAT students and to formalize the colloquial course title.
- More clear pre-requisite requirements to aid student understanding and to ensure pre-requisites can be correctly coded into SIMS.
- Using the convention "12 upper division IAT units including IAT 309w" as opposed to "9 upper division IAT units plus upper division writing course" we feel more clearly explains the requirement and signifies upper division maturity.
- Clarification of "SIAT Lower Division Requirements" to reduce confusion among students on which courses are mandatory for entry.
- Explicitly requiring IAT 309w as the upper division writing course. This is more realistic now that IAT 309w has been offered for a number of years. This course provides the most

appropriate discipline specific writing foundation for Capstone.

- Streamlined entry requirements for majors and joint majors alike.
- Removed old equivalent courses from TechBC (INTD 401/2/3/4/5/6) and added/kept the current equivalents (IAT 400 and 402).

RATIONALE:						
FPA 425 is a dance repertory course linked to production. Over the semester students learn and rehearse several choreographies in preparation for the performances at the end of the semester. This requires additional hours outside of the 8 contact hours of weekly class time.						
The extra rehearsals are an essential part of the course and are mandatory in order to ensure that the quality of the performances meets our standards of excellence. The added rehearsals plus 4-5 evening performances at semester's end require a significant time commitment on the part of the students, including as much as 50 hours outside of in-class time. We feel that the amount of work and additional time spent in the theatre justifies raising the credit hours from four to five. The students have also expressed a desire to increase their credit hours to acknowledge the amount of work and time required by the course.
