COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The primary purpose of this course is to provide an opportunity for students to work with adults in a literacy instruction situation. A secondary objective is to review contemporary literacy instruction methods and techniques as they apply to practicum situations.

COURSE FORMAT:

The course consists of:

- a) weekly two-hour class meetings
- b) thirty hours of practicum

Subsequent weekly meetings, practicum locations and times to be decided during this first class.
