This new internship course in the Masters of Digital Media (MDM) Program is in addition to existing DMED 530-6, Internship. The new course would be used in the case of a student who opts for a second internship semester.

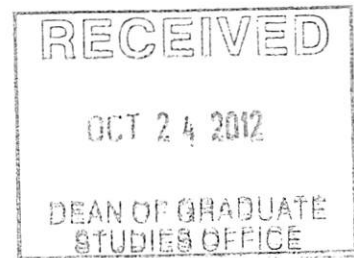

The new course proposal must also be sent to the Library for a report on library resources.





