### Summary of Changes:

- Formatting changes and consistent policy inclusion to enhance:
  - clarification of requirements
  - uniformity in explanation of like requirements between programs within the Beedie School of Business
- Specifically, inclusion and/or clarification of the completion timeline for BUS 207 (and equivalents) and BUS 254 in regard to admission versus program completion (*all programs, except minor & certain joint majors where this is not required*)

### Rationale:

These changes were prompted by suggestions made at SCUS to better articulate and clarify requirements through formatting and wording, which lead to a review of ensuring requirements that were implied became implicit and consistent across all relevant programs.

Clarifying the completion timeline for BUS 207 (and equivalents) and BUS 254 in regard to admission versus program completion, where applicable, ensures consistent formatting and communication of this timeline in all programs, not just some\*. It also makes sure that this timeline extends to the equivalents to BUS 207, where applicable, so that it does not appear that if an equivalent course is chosen instead, that it must be completed before admission.

*\* This update is in regard to updating programs where BUS 207 and/or BUS 254 are required and does not mean inclusion of these courses should one or both not currently be required.*

These changes were prompted by suggestions made at SCUS to better articulate and clarify requirements through formatting and wording, which led to a review to ensure requirements, that were implied, became implicit and consistent across all relevant programs.

The clarification of the use of upper division BUEC courses toward the joint honours with Economics is important, as many students do not realize they cannot apply upper division BUEC courses toward both their business program and also toward their economics program. The notation of such also maintains consistency between the Business and Economics joint major and joint honours programs, as this exists in the joint major already.

#### Admission Requirements - Beedie School of Business

Students who wish to pursue the joint honours program must be admitted to the joint major program. Upon completion of nine upper division Business units at SFU, students may apply for admission to the joint honours program. For entry and continuance, please see the grade requirements below.

For graduation, students must also meet the GPAs in accordance with University and Beedie School of Business.

#### Grade Requirements

In addition to normal university grade point average requirements, the Beedie School of Business requires a minimum 2.40 cumulative grade point average (CGPA) for entry into all 300 and 400 division business courses.

For a course to be accepted as fulfilling a prerequisite, or for a lower division requirement, or for a core course to be accepted in a student's program in business, a student must have obtained a minimum grade of C- (C minus).

- Specifically, inclusion and/or clarification of:
  - the minimum upper division units required in the Business major and honours programs
  - early access to upper division business courses by more than just majors, honours, and minor students
  - grade requirement for upper division BUEC courses in honours

### Rationale:

These changes were prompted by suggestions made at SCUS to better articulate and clarify requirements through formatting and wording, which led to a review to ensure requirements, that were implied, became implicit and consistent across all relevant programs.

Specifically, the clarification of the minimum upper division units required in the Business major and honours programs will ensure that this requirement is cohesive with the actual number of units completed at minimum when following the specifications of which upper division components must be met within the 36 upper division units for the major and the 48 upper division units for the honours programs.

Additionally, the clarification of whom early access to upper division business courses includes will ensure that all applicable programs are mentioned and that this change is applied consistently between the major and honours programs.

Lastly, the grade requirement change to the minimum CGPA on BUEC upper division courses to specify that this only applies to BUEC courses used toward the Business Honours requirements will mean that students pursuing a complementary Economics program, such as a minor, will not be held accountable to this requirement should they complete any upper division BUEC courses for their Economics program.
