SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF APRIL 7, 2014

1. Report of the Chair

The Vice-Chair noted that the Chair was attending the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada meeting in Winnipeg and passed on the Chair's regrets for not being at Senate.

The Vice-Chair reported on recent research news. Nick Hedley of Geography and his research team at Parks Canada and Pacific Rim National Park have secured \$1 million in funding through the National Search and Rescue Secretariat New Initiative Fund in support of their Coast Smart proposal. Approximately 70% of the amount will support SFU graduate students for two years. David Vocadlo of Chemistry has recently been advanced to a Tier I Canada Research Chair in Chemical Glycobiology. Dr. Vocadlo is also the winner of the 2014 Canadian Society of Chemistry (CSC) – Teva Canada Ltd. Biological and Medicinal Chemistry Lectureship Award for his distinguished contributions to the fields of biology and medicinal chemistry. He will be presenting an award lecture at the Canadian Society for Chemistry 2014 Conference, hosted by the SFU Department of Chemistry, in Vancouver during the first week of June. Majid Bahrami of Mechatronic Systems Engineering is the new Tier II Canada Research Chair in Alternative Energy Conversion Systems. Rosalie Tung of the Beedie School of Business has been voted as president-elect of the Academy of International Business' (AIB) executive board.
