**Visual Arts** 

Major

Entry to the Visual Art Major is granted based on an application at completion of FPA 160.

Admission to the Major is determined by both grades and portfolio assessment, usually scheduled at the end of the spring term. Contact the general office for further information.

Entry to the Visual Art Major is granted based on grades and portfolio assessment. Students who are not granted entrance into the major before starting their first year at SFU are encouraged to complete FPA 160 and FPA 161. Contact the general office for further information.

Honours

A Student must meet the requirements of a Visual Art Major to be eligible for the Honours degree. Entry to the Visual Art Major is granted based on an application after completion of FPA 160, 161 and 168. Admission to the Major is determined by both grades and portfolio assessment, usually scheduled at the end of the spring term. Contact the general office for further information.

Entry into the Honours program requires completion of FPA 461, a cumulative GPA of 3.0, and a 3.5 GPA in FPA courses. Students must also have Visual Arts Area approval to enroll in the Honours degree. Contact the general office for further information.
