#### Rationale for change:

This change is to allow students to complete both the CLSS (Certificate in the Linguistics of Speech Science) and TESL (Teaching English as a Second Language) certificates in Linguistics. Since Fall 2018, students are no longer able to complete both certificates due to the removal of LING 222. LING 200 was substituted for LING 222 in the CLSS program requirements while it was already a requirement for the TESL Certificate.

#### SFU calendar policy states:

Units applied to one certificate may be applied also to major or minor programs of a bachelor's degree under the normal regulations governing those programs but may not be applied to another Simon Fraser University certificate or diploma.

If students are able to complete both certificates, it provides them more career pathways.

#### **CERTIFICATE**

A minimum of 30 units comprising both lower and upper division courses is required. A maximum of six transfer units may be counted (up to six units of 100 division Italian language courses, or up to six assigned transfer units in humanities, history or FPA courses, or a combination thereof).

The program serves full and part-time students seeking educational enrichment in Italian Humanism from the early Renaissance to modern times—language and culture. It may be completed concurrently with, and complements major/minor programs in French, humanities, history and contemporary arts—a variety of major/minor programs in FASS and other faculties. It requires basic Italian language proficiency (writing, reading and oral skills), is intended for further literature, history and arts study, and may be completed with a degree program.

Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences BA students may complete the certificate so that some of the FASS breadth requirements are fulfilled by the same courses.



Certificate courses may also be used toward a major or minor program.
