The following changes are proposed to the tables on page 21 of the 2007/08 calendar:

Rationale

The new criteria match the admission criteria for TechOne. SIAT gets the majority of its students from Tech One, and they are admitted if they meet the new model specified above. The current SIAT direct admission criteria are more specific, in that they include Science 12, and as a result, potential SIAT students are not evaluated against the same admission criteria, forcing some of the students to work around the system or to give up on the SIAT program altogether. The proposed change will resolve these issues.
