MOTION

- b) that the responsibilities previously delegated to SCUS by Senate be delegated to SCAP, with the understanding that SCAP may further delegate appropriate responsibilities to SCUS, and
- c) that the composition of SCUS be changed, as follows;

 Registrar Secretary
 All Faculty undergraduate curriculum committee chairs or designates
 One undergraduate student Senator (Elected by Senate)
 One undergraduate student (Chosen by the Student Forum)
 Librarian Ex Officio (Non-voting)
 Director of Academic Advice Ex officio (Non-voting)
- d) that, other than specified above, the responsibilities and terms of reference for SCUS remain unchanged, and
- e) that the Terms of Reference for the Senate Committee on Graduate Studies (SCGS) be revised as follows:

from: To make recommendations to Senate on new course proposals. to: To make recommendations to the Senate Committee on Academic Planning (SCAP) on new course and program proposals. Change existing item 5.

from: To make recommendations to Senate on all Calendar changes. to: To make recommendations to the Senate Committee on Academic Planning (SCAP) on all Calendar changes."

The responsibilities and reporting line of the three committees of Senate with primary accountability in the area of academic planning lead too frequently to a confusion of roles. Indeed it can be claimed that, from time to time, poor planning has been the result.

In theory the divisions of responsibility seem clear. The separation of the graduate jurisdiction from the undergraduate presents no critical problem (though even here the boundary conditions are not impermeable). The separation of the "academic" valuing and adjudication of curricular change from the "administrative" costing and priority setting, however, is complicated. Frequently, questions raised in SCUS concerning priorities and costs are waived as properly the jurisdiction of SCAP. Conversely, when members of the Academic Planning Committee query the structure of a program, the quality of faculty, etc., they are reminded that such questions belong at the table of the Undergraduate Studies There are even occasions when what seem to be Committee. appropriate decisions regarding question propriety cause particular issues to go unaddressed in either committee. A much more common phenomenon is the ratification of major academic planning ventures presented as curriculum refinement to SCUS but not to SCAP.

But seriously, can a proper decision regarding academic plans be made at all without consideration of the quality of the curriculum, the competence of the program staff, the effect of the particular decision upon other departments? Can a proper decision regarding curriculum be made with no thought to resource needs? Senate is poorly served by such academic planning homework.

I expect to propose the following steps to Senate with the belief that academic planning and priority setting would be improved if these suggestions are accepted.

- 1. The Senate Committee on Academic Planning, unchanged, become the single route to Senate for all matters pertaining to academic programming.
- 2. That the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies become a subcommittee of SCAP and that the Senate Committee on Graduate Studies act as a subcommittee of SCAP insofar as its terms of reference include attention to academic programming. For other, non-program responsibilities, such as those pertaining to graduate students, SCGS will continue to report directly to Senate.
- 3. That the membership of the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies be changed as follows:
 Associate Vice President, Academic Chair.
 Registrar as secretary, non-voting.
 All Faculty undergraduate curriculum committee chairs.
 Two undergraduate student senators.
 Librarian and Director of Academic Advice or their designates (ex officio).

4. That the membership of the Senate Committee on Graduate Studies be unchanged.

Terms of Reference

1. To be responsible for the implementation of a system of academic planning based on S.80-98. Specifically, the Committee will undertake the following responsibilities:

a) to provide periodic assessments of the present and probable future environments of the University, its students, and its community;

b) to identify priorities for the development of new academic programs and emerging research areas;

c) to gather information concerning initiatives in the development of programs at all levels in the University;

d) to ensure coordination of academic planning with the provision of facilities and services, with financial resources, and with planning for the total post-secondary education system in British Columbia.

2. To review and recommend to Senate all proposals involving new programs, or major modifications to existing programs, according to the criteria specified in S.80-98.

3. To review existing programs according to the criteria set out in S.80-98 for the purpose of assessment and, in some cases, possible expansion, curtailment, or discontinuance.

4. In carrying out its responsibilities, the Senate Committee on Academic Planning may establish task forces or sub-committees to deal with particular tasks.

Approved by Senate at its meeting of October 6, 1975 to replace the former Presidential Committee - Academic Planning Committee. Changes in membership and changes in terms of reference approved by Senate, December 1, 1980. Revision in membership approved by Senate, October 4, 1982 (S.82-99). Revision in membership to reflect University reorganization approved by Senate, May 13, 1985 (S.85-33).

Committee meetings normally are scheduled monthly on Wednesdays, two days after the scheduled meeting date of Senate, at 2:00 p.m., with adjournment not later than 5:00 p.m.

SCAP reports to Senate in May of each year.

Quorum:

A majority of voting members, including one student.

Purpose:

A. To consider and make recommendations to Senate on all existing and proposed courses, taking into consideration: (1) the University's academic standards; (2) the need for coordination of all undergraduate academic activities within the University.

- B. To review the results of current evaluation processess and bring significant discrepancies to the attention of Senate, the Faculties and the Departments concerned.
- C. To recommend to Senate grading and examination practices appropriate to the University's education process to ensure: (1) reasonably consistent and equitable evaluation practices within and across courses; (2) the continued maintenance of high academic standards.

Delegation of Senate Authority to SCUS:

- 1. Senate delegated authority concerning waiver of the two semester time lag requirement before first offering of undergraduate courses (S.75-189).
- 2. On June 5, 1978, Senate delegated to SCUS the authority and responsibility to approve practicum courses (which have been formally approved by Senate) for use on Co-operative Education Programs. SCUS will periodically report to Senate its actions on those matters (S.78-73).
- 3. Senate approved, effective January 1, 1978 (S.78-10) the following motions, and revision to section (ii) on December 4, 1978 (S.78-159):
 - That the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies be authorized to i) conclude all matters dealing with proposed revision of an existing course unless such revision is undertaken in the context of a major program revision or entails the need for the allocation of additional resources.
 - ii) That such actions be reported in a summary form to Senate for information at its next meeting and the Board for ratification.
 - iii) Notwithstanding the authority granted to it, the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Studies retains the right to forward for consideration by Senate and the Board any matter which, in the judgement of the Committee or its Chair, requires such consideration.
- Senate approved on October 1,1979 delegation to SCUS of responsibility to receive, on a semester basis, reports from Deans of Faculties on topics covered under Special topics (S.79-90).
- Senate delegated to SCUS (July 7, 1980, S.80-96) authority to approve revisions in the list of courses recognized for inclusion in an area studies program.

6. Senate delegated to SCUS (December 2, 1985) responsibility to approve and review practices and procedures with respect to the University's registration priority system as set out in Senate paper S.85-59.

Original approved by Senate March 1, 1971. Membership and quorum revised January 8, 1973. Restructured August 12, 1974. Membership and quorum further revised September 8, 1975. Changes in student membership and quorum rule October 3, 1977. Revision of membership to include Faculty of Business Administration approved by Senate October 4, 1982 (S.82-99). Purpose

- 1. To ensure that the standards approved by Senate are maintained.
- 2. To consider matters of policy related to Graduate Studies and to make appropriate recommendations to Senate.
- 3. To consider matters referred to it by Departments and Faculties or by the Dean of Graduate Studies and to make recommendations to the appropriate body(ies).
- 4. To make recommendations to Senate on new course proposals.
- 5. To make recommendations to Senate on all Calendar changes.
- 6. To decide on admission or degree recommendations in those cases where the Dean of Graduate Studies is not able to approve.

Composition

- 1. The Dean of Graduate Studies Chair.
- 2. The Dean of each Faculty (or designate).
- 3. The University Librarian (or designate).
- 4. The Chair of each Departmental Graduate Studies Committee.
- 5. Two members elected by and from the Faculty Graduate Studies Committee in the Faculty of Education.

6. Two members elected by and from the Faculty Graduate Studies Committee in the Faculty of Business Administration.

7. A graduate student representative (or alternate) from each Faculty to be elected by and from the graduate students in the Faculty by in-person secret ballot at the Office of the Registrar.

8. The Registrar (or designate) (non-voting).

9. The Assistant Registrar - Graduate Studies (non-voting).

Duties

1. The Committee quorum shall be the Chair and six members of faculty.

2. A voting member of the Committee, who cannot attend a particular meeting, may send a qualified alternate. A 'qualified alternate' for a member of faculty shall be a member of a faculty who is qualified to Chair his/her Departmental Graduate Studies Committee under S.294 as amended. A 'qualified alternate' for a graduate student shall be a graduate student so elected at Simon Fraser University.

3. Elections for graduate student representatives and alternates shall be held once a year in the Fall semester. A sitting member is eligible for re-election

at the end of a term of office.

4. Replacement elections for elected members who resign from or cease to qualify for the Committee will be held as soon as practicable. A member elected in this way will serve for the remainder of the term of the member replaced.

This Committee was formerly called the Senate Committee on Change of name and terms of reference approved Graduate Studies. by Senate January 18, 1971. Committee composition revised by Senate March 6, 1972. Minor revision approved by Senate September 8, 1975 in membership of Librarian, membership again revised in December 8, 1976. Revision to election procedures for graduate student representatives approved by Senate June 7, 1982 (S.82-66). Revision of membership to include Business Administration approved by Senate October 4, 1982 (S.82-99). Revision of membership to include MRM representative approved by Senate February 6, 1984 (S.84-16). Revision of membership to include Women's Studies representative approved by Senate May 13, 1985 (S.85-29). Revision in membership to reflect University reorganization approved by Senate May 13, 1985 (S.85-33). Purpose revised to include responsibilities from the Executive Committee, Senate Graduate Studies Committee following its dissolution as approved by Senate December 1, 1986 (S.86-80).

SGSC reports to Senate in March of each year.
