EDUCATION 407-5

Field Based In-Service: Theory and Practice of Implementation

Calendar Description: (EDUC 407-5)..." for practising teachers to implement new curriculum or instructional techniques in their own classroom."

Grading: Pass/Withdraw.

EDUC. 407-5 provides a structure for teachers to use their own classrooms as the setting for systematically implementing new curriculum or instructional techniques. The course includes the following components: instruction in the theory and practice of implementation; classroom work; and seminars.

- I) Theory and practice of implementation: This component allows teachers to systematically study theories, issues and practices in school based implementation and planned change. (10 20 hours)
- II) Classroom work: This component recognizes that feedback, coaching, consultation and other aspects of on-site supervision are important features of successful implementation. EDUC 407-5 includes visits by a trained supervisor for observation, feedback and coaching. (approx. 30 hours)
- III) <u>Seminars</u>: This component provides a forum for teachers to learn from one another. The seminar is scheduled on a regular basis to monitor progress, discuss concerns and solve implementation problems. (10 20 hours)

Related coursework: EDUC 407-5 emphasizes the process of implementation and encourages teachers to identify relevant content unique to their professional needs. A fourth component, recent or concurrent education coursework, provides the academic and professional background on which to base the implementation projects.

Suggested Course Outline

This course provides teachers with an opportunity to examine problem and issues related to the implementation of new ideas in schools. This examination will be carried out through presentations, readings, seminars and field-based projects. Students examine their workplace to find successful and unsuccessful examples of implementation and to relate them to their individual project.

An important component of the course is the study of effective implementation and action research models.

The theory and practice of implementation sessions focus on topics such as:

- Identifying problems in teaching. How does one begin?
- Action Planning. How does one do action research?
- Models of Classroom Change. What approaches have worked in the past?
- Judging Effects. How does one know when one has succeeded?

Evaluation

Evaluation will be based on: seminar presentations; systematic observations and reports of field-based work; a final paper focusing on the design and implementation of the project.
