REPORT TO SENATE OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, SENATE GRADUATE STUDIES COMMITTEE FROM JANUARY 1984 TO DECEMBER 1984:-

The Executive Committee acted with delegated power from the Senate Graduate Studies Committee to:-

APPROVE:

- 1. Recommendations for the award of graduate degrees in 1984: 255 graduate degrees were approved.
- 2. Recommendations for Admission involving substantial doubt. One recommendation was considered and approved.
- 3. New graduate courses. There were 10 new courses approved; three in Mathematics, one in Biological Sciences, three in Kinesiology, one in Education and two in Business Administration. There were two courses deleted; one in Education and one in Natural Resources. There was a change in title and description for Kines 850 and MRM 644. Prerequisities were added for Educ 871, 874 and MRM 602, 612, 634, 646 and 651. There was a description change for Educ 870 and 871.
- 4. Graduate Curriculum changes were approved for the Department of Sociology and Anthropology.
- 5. Short courses sponsored by the Western Canadian Deans of Graduate Studies which carry one semester hours' credit was approved.
- 6. Approval of changes in the General Regulations Graduate Studies.
