ROWE, W. J. A.

William J.A. (Bill) Rowe, General Manager, B.C. and Pacific Northwest of Air Canada, was born in Manitoba and educated in Calgary, Alberta. It was there that he joined Air Canada (then Trans-Canada Air Lines) as a Passenger Agent. He has held a number of management positions in Calgary, Vancouver and at Corporate Headquarters in Montreal. He returned to Vancouver in 1975 as Director, Sales and Services for Western Canada in the Regional Office and in July, 1978, assumed his present position.

Mr. Rowe received his Master of Business Administration from Simon Fraser University in 1971. He has served as a member in a number of voluntary organizations, the most prominent being as National President of the Canada Junior Chamber of Commerce in 1964-65. He has always been active in the Board of Trade or Chamber of Commerce in the cities which he has resided.
