#### HOTION ON APPEAU PROCEDURES

Because there are clearly a number of outstanding grievances concerning admissions and standings, the Senate should establish an Admissions and Standings Appeal Committee as a separate and distinct body from the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Admissions and Standings.

## MEMBERSHIP

- 1. One member of the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Admissions and Standings to be selected by that body;
- 2. Two Sometore to be named by Semate, one of which chall be a student.
- 3. The Assistant Registrar for Admissions, who shall be a non-veting number and secretary to the Committee.

## TERMS OF REFERENCE

- 1. To how appeals on decisions of admissions and standings from applicants for admission or registered students;
- 2. To permit at its discretion representations directly made by any student appellant, the student embudemen, the Dean of Student Affairs, any of the Deans of Faculty, or any member of the Senate Coumittee on Undergraduate Admissions and Standings.
- 3. The Committee is required to give clear reason in writing to each appollant whose petition for admission, readmission, or adjustment of standing has been denied.
