COURSE DESCRIPTION

In this course students will use a variety of theoretical frameworks and practical considerations to understand and evaluate the pedagogical uses of multimedia in relation to curriculum design. Students will work collaboratively to design and produce a multimedia curriculum project for use within an educational setting. While it is expected that students will learn about new applications during the course, a basic level of information and computer literacy is assumed and required.

EXPECTATIONS

Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes, to complete assigned readings and coursework prior to class, to actively participate in group work and in-class activities, and to seriously engage with the themes and issues related to the course, both in-class and online.

Regular access to a computer and the Internet is required to participate in this course. You will need to have Internet access to complete many of the assignments in this course, therefore you will need access to a computer either at home or on campus at least 2-3 times during the week. Online or out of class activities may replace regular class time throughout the semester.

This course will make use of the FirstClass Conferencing system.
