#### Course Outline:

This course will focus on the theory and practice of elementary Social Studies by examining the curriculum and identifying beliefs about Social Studies and the way children learn.

Attention will be paid to the new trends in education with a focus on the recommendations from the Sullivan Report and their implication on the teaching of Social Studies.

Each session will require active participation and involvement in the design of the course. The activities will be engaging, diverse, practical and classroom tested.

- \* Examination of the curriculum
- \* Teaching/learning strategies, eg. Problem Solving, Decision Making, Data Collecting Techniques, Role Play
- \* Cooperative learning
- \* Literature and Social Studies
- \* Global Education

- \* Learning styles
- \* Evaluation strategies
