DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed to provide a conceptual framework to the teaching of Social Studies and to introduce participants to a variety of Social Studies teaching strategies and approaches. The course is suitable for both elementary and secondary level teachers.

Topics will include:

- Nature and Importance of Social Studies
- Current and Proposed Curriculum
- Teaching Strategies (e.g. simulations, media, community resources, inquiry)
- Teaching Issues
- Materials Development

Participants are expected to complete one major project and smaller session tasks as assigned.
