**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

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DESCRIPTION:

Global education is a cross-curricular approach to teaching which is based on concepts of interdependence, interconnectedness and perspectives consciousness. It provides relevance to what students are studying by making connections between the subjects, the school and the world.
