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**PREREQUISITE**

**COURSE DESCRIPTION**

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In this course, students develop a critical understanding of information technologies in education and learn how to integrate these technologies into classroom settings. An emphasis is on teaching strategies and methods as they complement the guidelines set forth in the B.C. Curriculum.

Students enrolled in this course should be interested in specific aspects of teaching and learning in 'technology-rich' settings. The course will focus on the role of IT as a general change agent in society, as a curriculum topic and as a tool used to promote specific types of teaching and learning. This course is not an introductory computing course or a training course in the use of educational software. While it is expected that students will learn about new applications during the course, a basic level of information and computer literacy is assumed and required.

Σ develop appropriate models and methods for the implementation and management of information and communication technologies (ICT) in educational settings.

Σ critically evaluate available information and communication technologies as they are used in learning and teaching including WWW resources, email and conferencing software.
