The course number (BUS 221) has been repurposed and is now being used for a new course that is NOT equivalent to BUS 251. Therefore, the equivalency language should be removed.

Rationale for change:

The BADM Certificate spans three concentrations in the Beedie School of Business. The breadth of concentrations and the associated scheduling difficulties have become barriers to completion of the Certificate. Furthermore, students have expressed interest in a focused approach to the Certificate. The change being made will permit marketing students to focus on marketing-oriented aspects of the program, and operations management students to focus on operations-oriented aspects of the program.
