I am pleased to submit the Annual Report of the Senate Policy Committee on Scholarships, Awards and Bursaries (SPCSAB) for the fiscal year 2015-2016.

Overview

SPCSAB is the committee charged by Senate with setting policy for the administration of awards, student scholarships, bursaries and other forms of financial aid at SFU. This is primarily for internal awards. Where adjudication is needed, three other Senate committees — SUAAC (Senate Undergraduate Awards Adjudication Committee), SGAAC (Senate Graduate Awards Adjudication Committee) and SCUH (Senate Committee on University Honors) — adjudicate financial awards to students. Bursary applications are processed by Financial Aid and Awards, which is a unit within Student Services.

SPCSAB is not responsible for setting the amount of money available for scholarships, awards or bursaries. We include for information, reports from both undergraduate (Appendix 1) and graduate studies (Appendix 2) indicating how funds were distributed. Policy decisions by SPCSAB in the 2015-16 period are detailed in Table 1.

The student has to provide a letter from SFU's Centre for Students with Disabilities confirming that the student is approved, by the institution, to study at a reduced course load. This will apply to all bursaries, work-study, in-course scholarships, awards, bursaries, and entrance scholarships, awards, and bursaries.
July 2016	Undergraduate Open Scholarship	Complete at least 30 units of standard graded courses over the last three terms of enrollment in such courses. For students who fall short of the 30 unit requirement because one term's enrollment was in a single course of five units or fewer, the last four terms will be considered and that term of one course will be set aside in determining unit and term GPA eligibility. A student with a disability who is approved, by the institution, to study at a reduced course load must complete at least 30 units of standard graded courses over the last five terms of enrollment in such courses
