

SENATE SUMMARY MEETING OF MAY 22, 2018

1. Report of the Chair

The Chair reported on recent research grant successes:

- In the *NSERC Discovery Grants* competition, SFU was awarded a total of \$1.72M for 57 projects, a success rate of 76%, which is an 11% increase over last year. In addition, seven SFU researchers were awarded *NSERC Accelerator Supplement* grants for a total of \$840,000.
- Nadine Provencal from Health Sciences received a grant of \$150,000 from *CFI's John R. Evans Leaders Fund* for her project *Exposure to Early Life Stress and Glucocorticoids: Mechanisms of System-wide Epigenetic Effects*.
- Glen Tibbits of Biomedical Physiology and Kinesiology received over \$100,000 for collaborative projects with the *Stem Cell Network*.

The Chair reported on recent research awards and honours:

- Arthur Robson of Economics has been appointed a *Fellow of the Canadian Economics Association* in recognition of his achievements and contributions to the discipline.
- A book summarizing three decades of linguistic and anthropological research involving BC's Secwepemc people, co-authored by Marianne Ignace of First Nations Studies, has received the 2018 *Basil Stuart-Stubbs Books Prize*.
- Brian Fisher of SIAT has been renewed as a member of the governing council of *NSERC*, which is comprised of 18 Canadians from the private and public sectors.
- Judith Marcuse, Artist-in-Residence and adjunct professor in the Faculty of Education, has become a *Pierre Elliott Trudeau Foundation* mentor. Up to 10 mentors are appointed each year to guide Trudeau scholars in their projects.
- Joy Johnson, Vice-President Research and International, has been honoured by the *Women's Health Research Institute* with its second annual *Career Contribution to Women's Health Research Award*.

The Chair reported that SFU had a substantial presence at the recent *BCTECH Summit*, with numerous displays featuring *SFU Innovates* programs, *KEY*, and a variety of SFU research projects. Vice-President Research Joy Johnson spoke on *Harnessing the Power of Data for Innovation*, and Director of Entrepreneurship Sarah Lubik moderated a panel on *Accelerating Innovation: What University Incubators Can Really Do*.

The Chair reported that SFU recently sent delegations to Victoria in April, and to Ottawa in May. The delegates met with elected representatives, key public officials, along with SFU alumni and supporters. The purpose of the visits was to recognize government's contributions and commitments, to provide updates on our progress and activities, and to discuss future priorities.

The Chair reported that SFU and the City of Burnaby recently hosted the *Burnaby Festival of Learning*, featuring over 90 free events that engaged participants of all

ages. This partnership with the City of Burnaby started during our 50th Anniversary Celebration, establishing the goal of hosting educational events throughout the community.

The Chair reported that, in his role as President, he had the opportunity to speak to the *Burnaby Board of Trade* on the role that universities, colleges, and institutes can play as community builders. The Chair noted he will also have the opportunity to speak on the same topic to the *Greater Vancouver Board of Trade*, followed by a conversation with the Honourable Janet Austin, BC's new Lieutenant Governor.

The Chair noted the upcoming 2018 Spring Convocation being held from June 12th to 15th.
